## OBGC REPORTS 2025 MILESTONES

### ***Under Armour Sports Apparel Contract Inked, Historic Record Enrollment, Regional Sports League Merger, “BOSS” Baseball League Announcement, Community Engagement & Impact Initiatives Launched***

**Olney, MD.** – The [Olney Boys and Girls Community Sports Association](#) (OBGC, or “Club”), a non-profit youth sports organization committed to offering children safe after-school and summer sports programs, achieved many milestones in 2025 as it continued to serve youth aged 5-18 seeking athletic opportunities to support their physical, social, and emotional growth.

Remaining true to its mission of serving thousands of children annually, in 2025, 6,555 children were registered in OBGC spring, fall, and winter sports and clinics, and sports camps. The number of children participating reached a record high for the Club in t-ball, house baseball and softball, cheer, flag football, instructional and development soccer, house soccer, soccer bugs, field hockey, lacrosse, multisport, basketball, wrestling, Harwood gym rats, and mini and regular football.

The year also marked the establishment of two amazing new partnerships with ***Under Armour*** and the ***Sandy Spring Athletic Association*** (SSAA).

In late 2025, OBGC signed an exclusive contract with *Under Armour* to serve as the uniform provider of its travel sports programs. The OBGC Board of Directors and travel sports commissioners celebrated the partnership by traveling to Under Armour’s world headquarters in Baltimore, Maryland, to see firsthand why the global sportswear company is an industry icon with its ongoing commitment to sports performance innovation.

The Sandy Spring Falcons, with a rich legacy of fostering teamwork and sportsmanship since the mid-2000s, merged into OBGC to prioritize the development and growth of the region’s athletes, according to Ben Corb, SSAA president. “Players and families from both organizations will benefit, and will gain access to the finest sports facilities and amenities in Olney.”

Sean Davis, OBGC baseball commissioner, just announced, “***The Olney Pirates*** and ***Olney Bucs*** will again become OBGC’s youth travel baseball program. It is exciting to know we are returning to our long-standing, winning roots with the home team and retiring *The Canes* as an OBGC travel baseball affiliate. This reflects a deeper commitment to our youth.”

Further, a new middle/high school baseball league known as “***BOSS***” will represent Brookville, Olney, and Sandy Spring as OBGC’s travel baseball teams. OBGC has long-standing, winning roots as the Pirates and Bucs, and will be retiring *The Canes* as an OBGC travel baseball affiliate.

As part of the SSAA merger, baseball and softball players also now have access to a new, 3,620 square feet indoor training facility. Located at 8001 Queenaire Drive in Gaithersburg, athletes can train year-round, with three fully enclosed pitching and batting cages and a workout area. OBGC will offer specialty clinics, lessons, and memberships for athletes to develop and grow.

Because OBGC is a 55-year-old community non-profit and known as a regional landmark, OBGC proudly provided community engagement opportunities for all Montgomery Countians to appreciate the Club's teams and 120 acres of ballfields and surrounding green space. The community was invited to watch youth teams compete on Saturday game days, OBGC's Olney Days' Movie Night to kick off the region's festivities, OBGC Fourth of July fireworks, the [Cropdusters collegiate baseball team](#) (Cal Ripken, Sr. Collegiate Baseball League) summer season, and the family-focused holiday fundraiser, [Winter City Lights](#).

In 2025, more than 370 needs-based scholarships were awarded to kids playing in OBGC sports programs. Fundraised dollars made these scholarships possible through the Youth Scholarship Fund, and like many nonprofits, OBGC is experiencing growing demand for additional scholarships. To meet this demand, along with the need to sustain the increasing use of the fields and facilities, OBGC launched an Impact Fundraising Initiative in December of 2025, which was led by every OBGC Board of Director member contributing. The organization will continue to meet the increasing needs of our community because of generous contributions from people who care about our children.

Brad Scott, OBGC Executive Director, commented, "Change and growth continued to be driving forces for OBGC in 2025 as we evolved to best serve youth and our community through sports and teamwork. We could not do it without our [Board of Directors](#), staff, and the countless volunteers, sponsors, and donors who make sports possible for every child in Montgomery County. Their partnership allows OBGC to remain committed to ensuring we never turn away any child."
